

Solar feed-in tariffs

Information for Victorian electricity customers

→ *The solar feed-in tariff is the amount your energy retailer will pay you back for exporting solar-generated electricity into the grid. If you're having trouble with a solar bill, contact EWOV.*

Solar metering

In Victoria, smart meters are set up so that:

- Your property uses the solar-generated electricity first.
- Only the **excess** solar-generated electricity is exported to the grid. You will receive solar feed-in credits from your energy retailer for every kWh exported.
- You pay for any electricity you import from the grid.

This is known as 'net' metering.

Will I pay GST on the solar I generate?

No. GST only applies to the electricity you import from the grid, not to the electricity you generate via solar.

Feed-in tariffs

Feed-in tariffs are set by the Essential Services Commission, and can vary each year. These are available for solar and other sources of renewable energy such as wind, hydro or biomass (within a system size less than 100 kilowatts). They will be applied to your electricity bill as a credit (Cr).

Your retailer must offer at least one of the following

General Feed-in Tariffs:

- **Single-rate:** this is a flat rate credited as cents per kilowatt hour (10.2 cents).
- **Time-varying:** the amount you are credited depends on the time of day you export electricity.

Timeframes are divided as per the table below:

Period	Weekday	Weekend	Rate (example only)
Off-Peak	10pm to 7am	10pm to 7am	9.1 c/kWh
Shoulder	7am to 3pm 9pm to 10pm	7am to 10pm	9.8 c/kWh
Peak	3pm to 9pm	n/a	12.5 c/kWh

Some customers may be on a **Premium Feed-in Tariff (PFIT)** if they signed up to this scheme before December 2011. It is important to note:

- You can change energy retailers.
- If you add new solar panels you will become ineligible for the PFIT.
- **PFIT rates will end on 1 November 2024.**

How can EWOV help?
